

FAQ's (Frequently Asked Questions)

Do I have to have a permit in order to register?

Yes, you do have to have an Oregon Permit in order to register for class. If you have an out of state permit you can register, but you have to register for the class as a “15-17 With License” which is a \$445 fee and you **would not** qualify for the Department of Motor Vehicle in-car testing waiver for your Provisional Driver License.

Can I register with an Interim Permit (paper copy from the DMV)?

Yes, you can as long as the Interim Permit has not expired. You will, however, have to show the permanent (hard plastic permit you receive in the mail) and a copy **BEFORE** the class starts. You can do this by going to the LBCC location closest to you and present your permit you received in the mail and a photocopy; the staff will then forward the copy to the coordinator. If you do not show your permanent permit before class starts you **will not** be able to attend class per Oregon Department of Transportation Traffic Safety Division 15 rules.

I am 18 or older do I qualify for the DMV Waiver?

Unfortunately, those students who are 18 or older when they complete the course do not qualify for the waiver of the in-car testing at the DMV. However, they do not have to take the written test.

When do I have to pay for the class?

We require that you pay at the time of registration.

Do I need my own insurance?

No, typically when an individual in a household obtains a permit, it is recommended that you make a “courtesy call” to your insurance company and let them know that there is now an individual with a permit living in the household who will be operating a vehicle. There is typically no charge for this and the students’ name will not appear on any of the paperwork. We then use the parent/guardian insurance information at the time of registration.

When can I register?

The first day that we start taking registrations appears on the website. We continue to take registrations until the class is full, at that time we would be happy to place the individuals’ information on a waitlist and you would be called if there was opening with a time limit to respond.

Does my student driver have to come with me to register?

As long as the student and parent have filled out and signed all the forms AND the individual coming to register has the student’s actual permit, they do not have to be present in order to register for class.

When do classes start?

Classes start at different times, depending on the location. Please check the current schedule on the website.

What if I miss a class?

If you miss a class please contact the coordinator as soon as possible so that you can schedule a make-up date. Please do not make arrangements through your classroom instructor, they are not authorized to verify make-up dates.

Can I take just driving lessons?

Yes, we have a variety of hours that you can register for with one of our Certified Driver Education Instructors. You would set up your own schedule with your assigned driver in the location that you live. Please contact the coordinator for more information.

How do I get me certificate?

Either the student or another individual has to come in to the location where the student took their class and show the **students' permit**. The individual coming in to pick up the certificate will be asked to sign for it. It can take up to **3 weeks**, in order to process all the required paperwork, from when the student completed their final in-car drive.

Can I open my envelope?

Yes, you may open the envelope with your certificate in it. We just label it as confidential due to the nature of the documents enclosed has personal information.

I have my certificate what do I need to do to get my Provisional License?

In order to get your provisional license you will have to meet Oregon state laws which are:

- 1) Be 16 years of age or older
- 2) Have had your permit for a minimum of 6 months.
- 3) Have documented proof that you have driven a minimum of 50 hours since you obtained your permit at the DMV.
- 4) Pass the Knowledge Test at the DMV
- 5) Have parent/guardian permission
- 6) Show your certificate/waiver at the DMV – please do not let them keep it, it is proof for your insurance company that you passed a certified Driver Education course.

I lost my certificate, how can I get another one?

You will need to contact the Driver Education Coordinator at 541-917-4849 to order a replacement certificate. It can take up to 2 weeks and there is a \$5.00 fee that is paid in advance.
